Take Action to Protect Oklahoma



Oklahoma currently ranks 43nd in the nation for meeting immunization requirements and protecting its children from preventable and deadly diseases. 1

- An increasing number of parents are opting their children out of important, required immunizations for non-medical reasons.
- The exemption rates for Oklahoma schools have steadily increased in the last five years.
 - o From the 2015-16 school year to the 2019-20 school year, total exemptions (including medical and nonmedical) among Oklahoma kindergarteners increased by over 62%.
 - o Immunization exemption rates were **2.6% for public schools** and around 5.3% for private schools in 2019-20.2
- When enough people in a community are protected against a contagious disease, it's hard for it to spread. 3
 - o The current immunization rate for babies aged 19-35 months is **67.3%** in Oklahoma. 4
 - o 91% of Oklahoman kindergarteners are up-to-date for all recommended immunizations.⁵


